Get on the phone and have a chat - speak to the artist concerned, or the holiday organiser, to check that they offer what you want and that the course will be suitable for your level of ability and expectations. Ask if they are able to cater for any special requirements you may have in terms of mobility, diet and so on.

Following a competition in the November 2010 issue of Paint, to win a painting break with Cheddar Painting Holidays we catch up with Norman Brett who won a painting course tutored by Tony Slater

Although the prize was for a three day holiday, Norman chose to extend this to a five day course and brought his wife Ellen who was a non-painter. Norman made everyone chuckle when he arrived, saying 'When the call came through to say that I had won a holiday, I thought it was a joke. I thought that it must be for a time share and that I would be asked to send off £100 which I would never see again!'
